In order to facilitate the sustainable operation of the Arkansas Foundation Seed Program and the processing facility, the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture (UADA) is changing the way we price Foundation grade seed. The new fee schedule will be updated annually and will reflect the total cost incurred by the UADA to produce and offer Foundation grade seed for sale. Since the final seed cost will be based on actual costs, the final price is not yet known. We have used production budgets to develop a cost estimate and will guarantee that the maximum price for 2023 seed orders will not exceed the prices listed below.

Rice: \$1.60 per lb. of seed sold
Soybean: \$1.50 per lb. of seed sold

If you are not a Certified seed grower and wish to order seed for general crop production, please use the attached form to place your rice and/or soybean order. Please understand the seed supply and allocation policy may limit or reduce the amount of seed available to growers not certified in the state of Arkansas. Beginning in 2023, Foundation seed will be available for pickup in mini-bulk bags. If you wish to take delivery of your seed in mini-bulk bags, please mark on the order form.

Please return order forms and deposits by Tuesday March 1st, 2022. Orders and deposits received after this date will be honored based on the date received and availability of seed requested.

APPLICATION for ADVANCE ORDERS of 2023 FOUNDATION RICE SEED

The University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture has a procedure whereby qualified Arkansas rice seed producers are required to place advance orders of Foundation rice seed for the 2023 planting season. If advance orders exceed the supply of a given variety, seed will be allocated in consultation with the Arkansas Seed Council based upon the attached policies.

A deposit of \$25.00 per 50 lbs of seed is required on all advance orders. All orders are **FIRM**. You are financially responsible for the full order and must pay the remaining balance by **July 1, 2023**. **If not paid in full, you will not be eligible to participate in the Foundation Seed Program until the balance is paid. If the Foundation seed of a requested variety is not available, your deposit will be returned.**

Please enter your order on this form and mail it along with the required deposit prior to **March 1st, 2022** to this office. Please make check payable to the University of Arkansas and mark for Foundation seed.

A deposit of \$25.00 per 50lbs of seed is required on all advance orders. All orders are **FIRM**. You are financially responsible for the full order and must pay the remaining balance by **July 1, 2023**. **If not paid in full, you will not be eligible to participate in the Foundation seed program until the balance is paid. If the Foundation seed of a requested variety is not available, your deposit will be returned.**

ARKANSAS SEED COUNCIL POLICY FOR ALLOCATION OF FOUNDATION SEED

1. If seed supply is greater than or equal to the amount of seed requested then all requests from priority 1, 2, and 3 growers (see below) will be filled.
2. If seed supply is greater than or equal to the amount of seed requested from priority 1 and 2 growers then all requests from priority 1 and 2 growers will be filled. Requests from priority 3 growers will be filled by setting a base allocation and a cap (maximum amount one grower can receive). Requests less than or equal to the base allocation would receive 100% of request. Requests greater than the base allocation would receive the base allocation plus a percentage allocation of the request above the base allocation.
3. If seed supply is greater than or equal to the amount of seed requested from priority 1 growers then all requests from priority 1 growers will be filled. Requests from priority 2 growers will be filled by setting a base allocation and a cap (maximum amount one grower can receive). Requests less than or equal to the base allocation would receive 100% of request. Requests greater than the base allocation would receive the base allocation plus a percentage allocation of the request above the base allocation.
4. If seed supply is less than the amount of seed requested from priority 1 growers then requests from priority 1 growers will be filled by setting a base allocation and a cap (maximum amount one grower can receive). Requests less than or equal to the base allocation would receive 100% of request. Requests greater than the base allocation would receive the base allocation plus a percentage allocation of the request above the base allocation.
5. For varieties on which no advance deposit is required for the first year and an advance deposit is required for the second year, a grower's request for the first year will be set at the lowest request for the two years.
6. These guidelines may be modified by specific action(s) of the Arkansas Seed Council.

ARKANSAS SEED COUNCIL GROWER PRIORITIES

PRIORITY

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Growers who have produced officially registered (purple tag) seed of the crop requested at least one of the previous two (2) years. (Immediate past crop does not count since certification is not complete.) In the event that a grower has purchased Foundation seed of a variety of the same crop for which the registered class of seed is not recognized, the grower's status will be considered Priority One if the grower has produced officially certified (blue tag) seed of the crop requested at least one of the previous two years (Immediate past crop does not count since certification is not complete).
2. Growers who have produced officially certified (blue tag) seed of the crop requested for the previous three (3) consecutive years. (Immediate past crop does not count since certification is not complete.)
3. Growers who are top producers and have officially certified seed of other crops within the past five (5) years. (Immediate past crop does not count since certification is not complete.)
